The Program started with discussion on the topic “Work life balance”, Dr. K. Mamatha,




In the second part Discussion was based on the topic, "importance of women in financial decisions at home".



There was an activity conducted for the students, it was an interactive session. The session was also very informative and useful. The session concluded by 1:30 pm.

On account of 'International Day of Action for Women's Health' an online session on "*Maintaining Health During Pandemic*" was organised by the Women Empowerment


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cell. The resource person for the day was **Dr Akshata Gowda**, Consultant Psychiatrist, Assistant Professor of Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur. The resource person started off with detailed explanation on how covid -19 transmits and how to stay safe during the pandemic. The principal mode by which people are infected with SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) is through exposure to respiratory fluids carrying infectious virus. Exposure occurs in three principal ways: (1) inhalation of very fine respiratory droplets and aerosol particles, (2) deposition of respiratory droplets and particles on exposed mucous membranes in the mouth, nose, or eye by direct splashes and sprays, and (3) touching mucous membranes with hands that have been soiled either directly by virus-containing respiratory fluids or indirectly by touching surfaces with virus on them. She emphasised on the use of mask and hand sanitizers which has to be considered as the new normal. Coronavirus can spread when people breathe, talk, cough, or sneeze. Wearing a mask keeps the virus from reaching others. If everyone wears a mask when they're out in public, fewer people will get sick.

She spoke on the depression and gave a clear understanding on what is depression and how it is different from being sad. She explained that depression is a mental illness in which a person is very unhappy and anxious (worried and nervous) for long periods and cannot have a normal life during these periods. She emphasis the fact that everyone can be affected by mental illness and its very important that people start acknowledging it and step out of the mental health taboo created by the society. It should be considered as normal as humans having physical illness and should be treated properly. She explained the different stages of depression and how one should handle it and when is it to seek a professional help.

Dr Akshata Gowda also spoke of anxiety and the prominence of proper sleep for a human body. She gave some tips for having proper sleep for those who has disturbed sleep. She was of the opinion that a good sleep always would keep our mind healthy.

A session on "Nutrition and Care for women" was organized by Women's Cell on 3rd march, 2020. The one-day programme was conducted for first year female students of St. Francis de Sales College. The Chief Guest and Speaker of the day, Dr. Annamma Thomas – Gynaecologist. She has explained the students, about the fact that Women needs more nutrients than men. The different nutritional needs are due to the male and female hormones.

She has addressed the gathering that the importance of Women Health, Better nutrition means stronger immune systems, fewer incidences of illness and better health. The nutritional status of women is important both for the quality of their own lives and the survival and healthy development of their children. She also mentioned regarding the fact that many working women face iron deficiency because of the blood lose during menstruation and also it is difficult for them to have a proper meal during the work time. So, it is important include meat, fish and poultry in the regular diet. Vegetarians can consume Spinach, kidney beans, black beans, lentils, split peas. These are high in iron source.

Women have to be very careful in observing the changes in the body. Instead of neglecting these, understand why it is happening. For example iron deficiency may lead to anaemia, tiredness etc. Deficiency of Vitamin B 12 may lead to tingling effect in hands and feet, irritability or depression. This is the time you have to consult your doctor and take the supplements.



But these supplements are useful in safeguarding you against occasional nutrients shortfall. They can't compensate for an unbalanced or unhealthy diet. To make sure that you get all the nutrition, you have to include fruit, vegetables, quality protein, healthy fats in your food.


She highlighted although malnutrition's effects on this group have been recognized for decades, there has been little measurable progress in addressing the specific nutritional problems of women and adolescent girls. Ignorance about the symptoms of malnutrition, such as the lethargy and depression caused by iron deficiency, may be dismissed as "normal" or unimportant, further exacerbating the problem.

At the end she voiced out that if these factors can be controlled then India would be a much better place to live in.

The doubts of the Desalites regarding nutrition for women have been cleared by the speakers. The feedback received from the Desalites was good. The Guest and the Guest of Honours felt happy about the reports of the Desalites.

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

A one day programme on **Cancer in Women** was conducted in our college on 16/09/2019. The programme was organised by Women cell. The resource of the day was Dr. Chinju Mariya Joseph MBBS, MD, St Johns Hospital, Bangalore.

The resource person delivered an insight on breast cancers in women. She very clearly explained the causes of cancer, prevention aspects for cancer, treatment layout etc.

After skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in women in the United States. Breast cancer can occur in both men and women, but it's far more common in women. Substantial support for breast cancer awareness and research funding has helped created advances in the diagnosis and treatment of breast cancer. Different people have different symptoms of breast cancer. Some people do not have any signs or symptoms at all.

Some warning signs of breast cancer are:

- New lump in the breast or underarm (armpit).
- Thickening or swelling of part of the breast.
- Irritation or dimpling of breast skin.
- Redness or flaky skin in the nipple area or the breast.
- Pulling in of the nipple or pain in the nipple area.
- Nipple discharge other than breast milk, including blood.
- Any change in the size or the shape of the breast.
- Pain in any area of the breast.



Breast cancer survival rates have increased, and the number of deaths associated with this disease is steadily declining, largely due to factors such as earlier detection, a new personalized approach to treatment and a better understanding of the disease.

She also shared her knowledge on Control of cancer under NPCDCS.

This programme created an awareness about cancer. Everyone felt it was an eye opener event.

A one day STREET PLAY ON WOMEN RIGHTS was conducted in the college on 17th January 2019. The programme was organised by Women cell. The final year students took the initiative of hosting a street play on the rights of women. The objective of this play was to give an awareness to the students in general of the significance women rights and the role of women in the society.

The programme was attended by the undergraduate and postgraduate students ,there were about 100 students who were part of the programme.

Students enacted a street play on Women Empowerment to give awareness about the importance of girl education. It includes areas of gender equality and access to education, and its connection to the alleviation of poverty.

It was an eye opener event. The play presented snapshots from a young girl's life in college, at home and during her everyday commute between these two locations. The college scene portrayed how in spite of the subtle discomfort felt due to unnecessary physical display of affection of male college mates, the young girl feels odd to complain or reject harassment. As she is homeward bound in a public bus, accompanied by a friend, she is targeted by a group of boys who feel no shame in harassing her and even retort back scathingly when she and her friend oppose their actions. Finally, she reaches home, perhaps hoping for a secure and loving welcome. But instead we find her brother and mother to be suspicious of her own conduct in public. Hearing of her ordeals outside home, the family decides to discontinue her education and get her married so that her 'wings can be clipped' denying her right to achieve her dreams. With the help of innovative songs, actions and dialogues,




the play emphasized the need to break the silence and oppose patriarchal social systems that oppress women. The audience enjoyed and appreciated the performance and even pledged to help change attitudes so that society can change for the better and free itself from the layers of violence. The programme concluded with the actors introducing themselves and a formal vote of thanks. The foyer was buzzing with action for a long time as members from the audience joined discussions with performers and the staff and students after the 30 minute performance.
