The sector which is generally not governed by the regulations and laws laid by the government are known as Unorganised Sector. Generally these sectors are low paid, no proper leaves, no provident funds, no proper holidays and no medical benefits are given to the employees working on this sector. This sector constitutes more than 90% of the labour workforce in India and it also contributes 50% to the GDP (according to National Commission for Enterprises in the Unorganized Sector).
